Dear Warden Plumley:

I have not received a phone call from Thomas David Deegan. Is this because he has not signed papers which violate his religious convictions? Injections in general and forced vaccinations in particular are against many people's religion and these convictions are respected in most states.

In Supreme Court of Appeals Case 15-1491, I am a co-complainant with Thomas, because we both have secular and ecclesiastical concerns involving not preferences, but convictions. My family had its own battle in Randolph County Circuit Court concerning religious convictions concerning the attempted mandate of vaccinating of my graduating daughter, Olivia Hudok. And religious conviction is what caused me to take a forced wearing of barcoded IDs battle at Elkins High School to the Supreme Court in 1999-2000. The Rutherford Institute successfully represented me.

I am unable to effectively assist Thomas as his plenipotentiary without proper communication. Is it true that even the Prison Chaplain cannot see Thomas at this time?

Warden Plumley, does it seem right that a person of strong religious convictions is prevented from communicating because he cannot violate his religious convictions, the very convictions which led to his incarceration?
